

1. CAE/C1 Exam Format Training, which is already available at ETAG, is a 16-hour training course which helps teachers to have a closer look at Cambridge Advanced English exam format, its content, skills and competences tested and the assessment criteria. The trainees will have the opportunity to draw parallels between CAE requirements and C1 level descriptors of the Common European Framework. After completion of the course teachers will feel more confident to continue to work independently on the CAE exam material and to get prepared for a real test.

2. FCE/B2 Exam Format Training is a 16-hour training course which helps teachers to have a closer look at the First Certificate English exam format, its content, skills and competences tested and the assessment criteria. The trainees will have the opportunity to draw the parallels between FCE requirements and B2 level descriptors of the Common European Framework. After completion of the course teachers will feel more confident to continue to work independently on the FCE exam material and assist their students to get prepared for a real test.
